Welcome to Year R/1

We hope that you will find this guide useful but do not hesitate to ask if you require further information. We are here to help the children learn! The children in the Year R/1 class will be taught by Mrs Rudd on Mondays, Tuesday and Wednesday and Mrs Nute on Thursdays and Fridays.

The Teaching Assistant working in the team will be: Mr Goodeve, Mrs Hill and Mrs Bullock.

YR/1 wider Curriculum Topics this year:

A lot of time is spent ensuring that objectives are covered in both year groups. The school year will start with our Learning Adventure based on a historical focus: 'The sinking of the Titanic' followed by the 'Gunpowder plot.'

In Science lessons, over the year, we will be studying a range of units, starting off with 'All about me'

The children will also be involved in Music, Art, Outdoor Education, PE, IT, R.E and PSHE activities which will give them a broad range of educational experiences across the year.

Where we can, we work through a cross-curricular approach so geography, DT, Art, Music and IT will be closely linked to our Learning Adventure work.

Class work

We are looking forward to an exciting year with your children. We aim to set work appropriate for pupils' individual needs. Your child will be expected to work independently, with an adult or in group situations as appropriate to the task and their learning needs.

Reading

We ask every child to read for at least 15 minutes everyday at home and for their reading record to be signed by an adult. These books will be checked everyday and will be used by the adults in the class to see when your child is ready to achieve their reading karate bands. Reading karate bands will be awarded for every read completed at home and children will need to read at least 4 pages for it to count towards a karate band. We change their reading book at least once per week (depending on their colour) during their phonics session and we will change their books for pleasure in school too.

Homework

We will not be giving large amounts of homework. We expect the children to work hard at school and to take responsibility for their learning. Reading at home is the most important activity, followed by learning spellings. Here is a list of the common exception words your child needs to be able to spell by the end of year 1. Please could you practice these at home:
